COMMONLY USED ACRONYMS, SYMBOLS, ABBREVIATIONS, AND TERMS FOUND IN RESEARCH AND EVALUATION STUDIES

Often, when you pick up a research or evaluation study or report to read or assess, the terms, abbreviations, symbols, or acronyms used within it are rather confusing. Researchers who write such reports need to be both technical and precise; however, they should be able to write their studies in much simpler ways than they do. The dissemination of important knowledge needs to be conveyed in ways that all consumers can understand (a main rationale for this glossary). The following is not a complete listing of such terms, just ones that pop up with high frequency in various research studies, reports, and journals.
